TogetherGreen: A Growing Grassroots Movement







- TogetherGreen's programs have directly engaged 203,000 people in 520,000 hours of conservation programming—from prairie restoration to energy audits.
- Through its current participants and alumni network, TogetherGreen has a presence in **182 cities** in 49 states.
- More than 35,000 volunteers have helped improve nearly 10,000 acres of habitat and planted more than 104,000 trees.
- Young people from across the country have raised 7,900,000 million pennies for the planet.
- Program participants hail from urban, suburban, and rural areas, and represent a diverse group of constituents, including Spanish-speaking students, rural landowners, city building managers, low-income urban residents, wine makers, and artists.
- TogetherGreen grantees have partnered with hundreds of organizations as diverse as **Habitat for Humanity**, Auburn Theological Seminary, the Jamestown S'Kallam Tribe, San Elijo Lagoon Conservancy, Dayton Chamber of Commerce, **The Nature Conservancy**, and the Academia Semillas del Pueblo, to name just a few.
