#### 3. PROJECTS & PROJECT COMPONENTS

#### a. Micro Financing







The project is in collaboration with Helping Hand. Project aims to provide micro financing to deserving ladies who already have or want to have some source of income like tailoring, small retail shop etc.

#### b. Vocational Training Center





This project in collaboration with Mustafai Foundation aims to impart skills to household

women so that they may become an earning hand to support their families. For the purpose a training and skill development center has been setup in Rawalpindi. Training session for 5 per person session is conducted for every quarter for a period of 3 months. Foundation has planned to open and operate similar kind of training centers in different areas of need to provide services to the deserving women in those areas.

#### c. Advocacy

Foundation also under takes different awareness and advocacy seminars and workshops for awareness of women rights and violence again women and children. Foundation conduct campaigns in different areas with the help of different local partners.

#### 6. OVERALL PROGRESS

#### 1) Micro Financing Project

#### a) Short Term Loans – (HH)

During the period July 2010 to December 2013 Foundation has, in collaboration with Helping Hand, given a total amount of 21,79,000 to more than 154 deserving persons for setting up their businesses.

# b) Women Economic Empowerment through Interest free Microfinance (WEEM) and Distribution of Business Materials Project

In this Women Economic Empowerment through Interest free Microfinance (WEEM) project material among women in Rawalpindi and suburbs were distributed to enable them to create a source of earning for their family. A total of 97 women were benefited from this project. During the ceremony Ms. Riffat, community representative, said that the package of rupees 20, 000 was not enough to start a new business and it would be difficult to repay the loan in ten installments even if someone succeeded in starting a business. She requested to either increase the loan size up to 30, 000 rupees or decrease the monthly installment to Rs 1,000 per month. So January 1st 2013 the community have increased amount of loan package of rupees 30,000 per client.



Mr. Wasim after brief introduction of the program explained the repayment schedule and said that anyone who repaid the loan according to the schedule will become eligible for securing another loan from this program. He also presented a number success stories from neighboring UCs and concluded that HHRD's Interest free microfinance aimed at empowering women of marginalized community through home based enterprise development.

After completion of the agreement and receiving formats the business material was handed over to 38 women as per following details.



#### 2) Vocational Training Center.

Foundation has conducted different training sessions during the last three years imparting sewing and tailoring skills to household women and female student of schools and colleges. Around 3 women have so far been imparted vocational skills. Most of these participants are the household women with poor financial position. Training aims to provide them opportunity to develop sources of their earning. Among the participants there were also female students, who will be using these skills to develop their own small business units relating to embroidery and tailoring etc. successful participants



are also awarded with training completion certificates. Following are the details of such training sessions:

#### a) Participation in Protest against Women Violence: Sukh Foundation together with other Civil Society Organizations Held Peaceful

Demonstration to Accelerate the Approval of Domestic Violence Bill and its Subsequent Implementation Citizens belonging to various walks of life, especially, social workers, house wives, media representatives, students, educators and lawyers jointly brought out a peaceful Picture demonstration demanding immediate approval of domestic violence bill from the National Assembly and the Senate here in Sukh, Tehsil Rawalpindi dated 26 February 2011.
