##### *Summary*

In accordance with article 22, paragraph 7 of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification, rules 6 and 7 of the rules of procedure of the Conference of the Parties (COP), decision 26/COP.1, and decision 5/COP.10, one intergovernmental organization (annex I), a list of non-governmental and civil society organizations (annex II) and a list of business and industry entities (annex III) are proposed for accreditation at the eleventh session of the COP. Updated lists of national, international, governmental and intergovernmental organizations (annex IV) and non-governmental and civil society organizations (annex V) accredited to the COP are also contained in this document, assuming that the proposed organizations are accredited by the COP at its eleventh session.

## I. Background information

1. Article 22, paragraph 7, of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) states: “The United Nations, its specialized agencies and any State member thereof or observers thereto not Party to the Convention, may be represented at sessions of the Conference of the Parties as observers. Any body or agency, whether national or international, governmental or non-governmental, which is qualified in matters covered by the Convention, and which has informed the Permanent Secretariat of its wish to be represented at a session of the Conference of the Parties as an observer, may be so admitted unless at least one third of the Parties present object.” Rules 6 and 7 of the rules of procedure of the Conference of the Parties (COP), adopted by decision 1/COP.1, contain provisions to similar effect.

2. Decision 26/COP.1 contains provisions for the accreditation of non-governmental and intergovernmental organizations to the first and subsequent sessions of the COP. Decision 5/COP.10 contains the revised procedures for the accreditation of civil society organizations and representatives from the private sector to the COP and their participation in meetings and processes of the UNCCD.

## II. Introduction

3. Annex I and annex II to this document list the intergovernmental organizations and non-governmental organizations and other civil society organizations that have submitted a request for accreditation by 1 September 2013, and that are proposed for accreditation to the COP at its eleventh session.

4. Annex III lists the business and industry entities that the secretariat proposes for accreditation as observers to the COP, in compliance with the provisions contained in decision 5/COP.10.

5. Assuming accreditation by the COP at its eleventh session of the organizations listed in annex I and annex II, annex IV and annex V contain the updated lists of national, international, governmental and intergovernmental organizations and of non-governmental and civil society organizations accredited to the COP.

## III. Recommendation

**6. In accordance with the provisions mentioned above, the COP at its eleventh session may wish to accredit as observers the intergovernmental organizations listed in annex I to the present document, the non-governmental organizations listed in annex II and the business and industry entities contained in annex III.**
