WEC MEDICAL SERVICES AND CARE having realized the need for women Elderly to improve their livelihood has through Education, Medical services (thru: Patients education, disease awareness & indigent medical care), initiate a project on domestic income generating enterprises, Girl child education and reproductive health in this area.

WHAT WE DO

- ❖ We facilitate **Education** (through coordinating needy children/Orphans) with sponsors/organisations together with our Partner schools.
- ❖ We provide basic **health care/Medical care** (Patients education, disease awareness & indigent medical care) along with Home based care, Sensitisation, and Domiciliary services and that will meet the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of patients and community in a holistic manner. We offer a medical program that is run to provide: clinical services, promotion of health at community level and home based care. Workers are trained in medical and nursing care. The spiritual aspect of health care is emphasized in all the projects.
- ❖ In addition to basic two services, (Education and Health), We offer Rehabilitation and related welfare support for Women, Elderly and Children; Nutrition Programs and talent development amongst others "**We make living by what we receive and make life by what we give**"

During the last years, we have been piloting the Education program with a small group of children with poor family background and have seen dramatic improvements with most of the students increasing their reading ability by one to two grade levels. We have seen measurable success and we are now seeking to expand our WEC Care Education Program to address the needs of all the at risk children in our community.

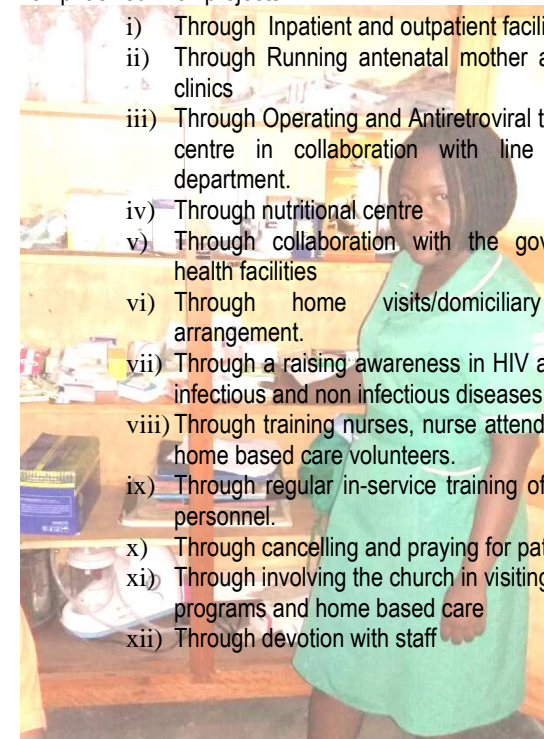


SERVICES OFFERED:



1) We provide health care that meet the physical, emotional & spiritual needs of patients in a holistic manner. A medical program is run to provide clinical services, promote health to community level and home based care. Volunteers as staff, intensively trained in medical care, nursing care & psychosocial care. The spiritual aspect of health care is emphasized in all projects.

- i) Through Inpatient and outpatient facilities
- ii) Through Running antenatal mother and child clinics
- iii) Through Operating and Antiretroviral treatment centre in collaboration with line ministry department.
- iv) Through nutritional centre
- v) Through collaboration with the government health facilities
- vi) Through home visits/domiciliary setup arrangement.
- vii) Through a raising awareness in HIV and other infectious and non infectious diseases.
- viii) Through training nurses, nurse attendants and home based care volunteers.
- ix) Through regular in-service training of medical personnel.
- x) Through cancelling and praying for patients.
- xi) Through involving the church in visiting programs and home based care
- xii) Through devotion with staff



2) We provide professional and quality medical services to Women, Elderly and Children through working with community women by availing them with

- i) Free Laboratory diagnostic services and Drugs
- ii) Outreach and free treatment of children, women and Elderly,
- iii) Free Antenatal and postnatal Care services amongst others, depending on availability of resources
- iv) Developmental projects that will earn them income, nutrition and improve their level of understanding especially on policies benefiting them and help in general (capacity building) this includes their children.
- v) WEC shall always collaborate with Donor community to promote self reliance of the Services offered by the

organization (WEC) by establishing projects that will generate income to run WEC programs

- vi) We provide or assist in provision of social and other services as need may arise for, example medical or health services, education services, home improvement services among others.

3) We voluntarily indulge ourselves into the following undertakings amongst others;-

- i) Education, Health, Rehabilitation and related welfare support for women, elderly and children.
- ii) Nutrition Programs
- iii) Education and Children Sponsorship schemes
- iv) Human rights, Advocacy and legal aid for women, elderly and children.
- v) Skill training for women, elderly and Youth.
- vi) Talent development and exposure for women, children and elderly.

vii) We provide daily counseling services of teenagers especially changing the mindset of those whose lives solely depends on prostitution. ***It's important to note that*** leaving these girls without equipping them with skills, without providing them with basic needs, leads to the same prostitution, nude dancing and drugs.

MONITORING AND EVALUATION

Although we shall use external evaluators, at the moment we have an internal system of evaluation where stakeholders in the project sit and see performance standards which are based on for evaluations thus measuring performance. This will apply to staff, women welfare councilor and active beneficiaries. This will be done quarterly.

Duties and responsibilities to stake holders are set in a way of systematically analyzing and documenting the important facts about their duties in line with the project objectives.

Stakeholders will receive timely, frequent and specific feedback so as to understand what is expected of them to repeat successful performance and to improve their work when necessary. We will prepare monthly, quarterly and annual reports and will also prepare reports as required by the Funding Organization.
