To increase access and utilization of HIV prevention services among inmates in Patongo prison

implemented by WOSO for 1 year

- To increase access and utilization of HIV/AIDS care, treatment and support services to inmates in Patongo prison
- To establish effective referrals, linkages and partnerships for comprehensive HIV/AIDS care and treatment services among inmates
- To promote economic empowerment to increase income levels of inmates for improved quality of life upon released from prison.

Activity in HIV Prevention services includes; awareness creation, HIV counseling and testing(HCT),Risk reduction counseling. Activity in HIV/AIDS care and treatment includes: Referral for HIV Care services like, Home based care, ART services, linkages and referral, psychosocial.

Activity in economic empowerment in includes:vocational skills training (tailoring and garment cutting, carpentry and Joinery, Bid and baskets making), nutrition support(Kitchen gardening)

All activity implemented in collaboration with Patongo health centre III, ART clinic.

WOSO-SCIHA Project employed holistic and sustainable approaches to increase access and **HIV/AIDS** utilization of prevention. and care. treatment and support services among inmates. In Patongo prison

Some of the approaches includes; HCT-4 Tent Model out-reaches, Formation of ART Mentor clubs Post-Test Mentor Club, train and support referral specialist who link inmate to health facility, working with VHT to support referral, follow-up, counseling Some of the project remarkable achievements:-

Partnership where WOSO-SCIHA Project enjoys collaboration with Agago district leaderships, Patongo health centre. Prison authority to improve HIV/AIDS services delivery in the prison

The ART Mentor Club (Club of HIV+ inmates) has enabled us mentor ART adherence where HIV+ inmates counseled on ART adherence, mobilized and sensitized on ART services,

The Post-Test Mentor Club (Club of HIV- inmates) has enable us mentor inmates on HCT, HIV prevention services, Risk reduction, awareness creation through drama and dialogue

Referral specialist enable us referred and linked inmates for HIV care and it related services at the health facility, created sustainable link between prison-health centre for HIV services

Through empowering, engaging and working with ART Mentor Club, Post-Test Mentor Club, Referral specialist, VHT, Health centre, Partners approaches, WOSO-SCIHA project continues to address and mitigate HIV/AIDS Scourge among Key Population in the prison where services are most needed beyond PEPFAR funds.

Project Success story and best practices.

HIV/AIDS Prevention services.

525 Inmates (452 Males and 72 Females) sensitized on HIV prevention services including basic facts about HIV/AIDS and myths, negative attitude and peer influence, alcoholism, correct and consistence used of condom, Safe male circumcision-SMC, PMTC, HCT benefits.

As a results of the sensitization 496 inmates(427 female , 69 females) tested for HIV and 15 identified HIV+ results (11 Males and 04 females) where linked and accessed ART services from Patongo health centre III, 10 inmates supported and accessed Safe Males Medical Circumcision (SMMC) services at Patongo Health centre III

32 HIV+ males inmates provided couples HCT at home with partners upon the released from the prison to prevent HIV transmission among couples and 2 females partners tested from home upon released of their husband found HIV+ results and they were counseled and linked to nearby health centre for ART services

98 inmates(64 males and 32 Females) provided risk reduction counseling services to enable them maintain their HIV negative status,

WOSO uses one on one and groups dialogue meetings as one among other approaches to educate inmates on HIV prevention, the approach is youths friendly, since it is conducted at youths friendly

environment where they interactions freely and openly,, some of the key questions raised during dialogues are:-

- 1. How long will the HIV signs and symptoms are seen out when a person get HIV?
- 2. One condom can be used for more than two rounds when having sex?
- 3. If one get HIV infection today and test tomorrow will the result be HIV+ already?

Members deeply understood about HIV.

HIV/AIDS care, treatment and support services.

Inmates who are HIV + enrolled, supported and linked to Patongo health centre III and they accessed comprehensive HIV/AIDS care and treatment services including Opportunistic infections(OIs), CTX, TB, STI/STDs, ART services.



Nutrition garden comprises of verities of including the verges Tomatoes, Green papers, plan. vegetables, Egg onion etc which has improved the nutrition of the HIV positive inmates and OVC in the prison.HIV+ inmates

provided ART awareness creation, stigma, discrimination, complacence and gender issues, ART adherence and risk reduction counseling services, ART adherence counseling and risk-reduction counseling support

37 HIV+ inmates (28 Males and 9 Female) provided home based care services including psychosocial support, guidance and counseling, follow-up of ARV treatment adherence protocol etc., 5 HIV+ inmates identified and trained as ART adherence counselors and referral specialists who strengthened ART adherence, referral network and advocacy for HIV+ inmates rights and HIV/AIDS services delivery in Patongo Government prison

The project created very good working relationship/partnership with Patongo health center III in provision of HIV/AIDS services to the inmates in the prison, Patongo town council authority, NGOs partners, Prison authority and Agago district Local government, these made project implementation successfully.

Vocational skills training for inmtaes to improved their economic upond resleased from prsion .

Beads making skills training.

20 inmates provided 6 months skills training on beads making;- These are the products of the beads which comprises of the verities of deigns including recklessness, bangles, hand bags etc, it is very exciting and very beautiful with high demand from the markets, the skills inmates gained from these hand craft making will help them start their own at home upon released from the prison to generate



them income to support their families. The materials are locally available.

Baskets making skills training.



Carpentry and Joinery skills training.

20 inmates provided 6 months skills training on baskets making, samples of Hand baskets made which is good for shopping in the markets, it is very nice and it was a product from peparious grass, pills of difference colures. Materials are locally available upon released inmates will continue making it at home to improve their households incomes levels.

15 Inmates were trained 6 months with the skills and knowledge in carpentry and joinery, the specific skills provided are make Chairs Tables, Beads, Shoes rakes, Chairs, stool etc. they testified that the skills the gained upon released from prison, they will put it in practice and start generating money to meet their families basic needs

15 inmates ungone 6 months skills training on tailoring and gament cutting, they were trained with the skills and males, females knowlages in making and children dressese of difference fashions., The skills these inmates gained will help them upon released from prion to start up their own tailoring workshop at their respective village and make money for their income to meet their family beasic needs and improve their quality of life and they live a productive life in their community(ROCO KWO), These trained inmates promised that the skills they gained after
