THE PIG PROJECT

The Donation of 40 Pigs to Eden Ministries Uganda has continued the work or empowering women and bringing together families by affording recipients the opportunity to raise pigs, creating a sustainable solution for food and income.

An investor by the name of Godfrey donated 40 pigs to Eden Ministry to give and monitor to people in different communities. Even though it was a tremendous blessing, it did not come without its challenges.

Initially, the monitoring of pigs with their families were a bit difficult. That's how Eden Ministries became involved, so they can take care of the pigs. Families that are in need are given the piglet project.

This project was created as a system for success. There are 40 pigs. Each family receives 1 pig. Therefore, 40

families will be involved in the piglet project.

With that project, if a pig gives birth, then 2 piglets are returned to the project. One piglet is returned to Eden Ministries, the other one goes to a person in need, and the rest remains to that person who has that pig. This creates a way for the family to create income, food, and continue to raise pigs.

If the pig produces a 2nd time, the same process is repeated. After the 2nd delivery, the pig and the piglets remain with the family.

Eden Ministries is going to oversea this project. Monitoring every home that takes care of a donated pig, to provide knowledge of caring for the pig and offering services to maintain the pig's health and providing food.
