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I. INTRODUCTION

The Non-Profit Organization named 'AFPDE asbl in French acronym' is operational since its creation in various fields among them are sexual violence, health, emergency, agriculture and education through support to female groups, to local committees, medical structures and health zones for the improvement of the health status and hygiene of the most vulnerable populations and in the reinforcement of protection and economic power of women in rural areas.

During the year 2017, its interventions were particularly in the framework of the partnership with 'Action Medeor', especially in the implementation of two projects, one of which is the "Prevention and Treatment of Malaria and HIV/AIDS in Uvira and Walungu territories "co-financed by the BMZ and the other one is "Emergency assistance to Burundian refugees and members of local communities in difficult situation in the health zone of NUNDU "co-financed by the German Ministry of Foreign Affairs (AA). The second is the most substantial and will continue, as for that co-financed by the BMZ, until the end of the year 2018.

In addition to 'Action Medeor', AFPDE also benefited from the financial contribution of three other partners for the implementation of its activities in 2017: it is about the organization 'MEDICA MOMDIALE, MEMISA Belgique and KTCT UK'.

The emergency support project for Burundian refugees and local communities in difficult situation is created on the needs expressed by the UNHCR and the NUNDU health zone since January 2016, on the fact that Burundian refugees and home community members do not have easy access to medical care, clean drinking water, good hygienic conditions and HIV/AIDS and malaria prevention measures, to the education of orphaned and HIV-affected children as well as children of displaced and refugees. Those people were living in a difficult situation after the disengagement of several other partners who intervened on the ground in emergency.

In response to this situation, 'ACTION MEDEOR', with the support of the German Foreign Ministry, has agreed to accompany AFPDE in order to provide a quick response to this situation in which refugees and host communities lived.

The objectives of this project are the following:

a) Improvement of basic health care, maternal and child care for 50,000 refugees and 20,000 vulnerable members of the local population.
 b) Improvement of hygiene, sanitation and water supply conditions for about 50,000 refugees

and 30,000 vulnerable members of the local population.

c) The enrollment of 200 orphaned children and affected with HIV/AIDS.

d) The construction and facilities of a school in the city of Uvira to educate orphaned, displaced and refugee children.

In order to facilitate the implementation of this project, collaboration agreements have been signed with the health zones, the UNHCR, the rural hydraulic service, the medical structures and various companies of construction.

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The main objective of the project is to contribute to the lasting improvement of the food and nutritional security of the final beneficiaries in a context marked by a price fluctuation of the foodstuffs.

The initiatives of this project aim to enable refugees and host communities to have an easy access to quality health care, to access drinking water in large quantities and to fight against water-borne diseases, HIV/AIDS and malaria, and to the orphaned children, affected children of HIV / AIDS, displaced and refugees children to have access to education.

The project of prevention and treatment of HIV/AIDS and malaria which is financed by ACTION MEDEOR with the contribution of the BMZ and AFPDE benefits exclusively to the communities of Uvira and Walungu territories living in the Ruzizi plain from Uvira to Kamanyola, either 4 health zones namely Uvira, Ruzizi, Lemera and Nyangezi.

The financing received from MEDICA MONDIALE and MEMISA Belgique concern specifically women and girls who are victims of sexual violence from Kamanyola and Kaniola in the Territory of Walungu for MEDICA MONDIALE and LUBARIKA in the Territory of Uvira for MEMISA Belgique. The two supports enable women and girls who are victims of sexual violence to have access to medical care, psychosocial care, legal and economic support.

As for the project of construction and facilities of a school in the most disadvantaged quarter of Kilibula, it will enable orphaned, refugees and internally displaced children to have access to education with the same conditions as children of the whole world.

This activity report covers the achievements from January to December 2017 in all the 3 Territories of South Kivu Province in which the AFDE worked during this period.

This report has two main parts:

- Part I: Context of the achievements of activities and
- Part II: Stock of achievements in 2017

Part I. CONTEXT OF ACTIVITIES ACHIEVEMENTS

I.1. On the security and humanitarian level

The security context of the province of South Kivu in general and the territories of Uvira, Walungu and Fizi in particular is characterized by generalized insecurity caused by the activism of local and foreign armed groups that is raging in this part of our country. According to the report of the international organization Human Right Watch, the provinces of North Kivu and South Kivu have more than 125 active armed groups.

The latter are causing deaths and desolation to peaceful citizens in addition rapes and violence against women and girls, the recruitment of children into their ranks, pillage and structures of cultures and houses, robberies, kidnappings and robbing, ... In addition to the activism of the armed groups, the sub-regional security context has a great influence on the security situation in this part of South Kivu province. With the situation of political instability in Burundi and the abuses

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committed on the populations in this country, several armed attacks were carried out by these groups and also caused the death of persons.

The security situation in the province of South Kivu and Burundi have been the basis of mass and repetitive population displacement and the mass influx of Burundian refugees into the three territories of intervention of AFPDE since 2015 until day.

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According to OCHA's October 2017 report, the province of South Kivu has more than 545,000 internally displaced persons. Many of these people live in Uvira, Fizi and Walungu Territory because of ongoing fighting between armed groups and government forces in several localities in these three territories. Apart from the internally displaced, these three territories also received several Burundian refugees fleeing the abuses in their country. Currently, UNHCR has more than 40,000 Burundian refugees, of whom more than 30,000 live in Lusenda and Mulongwe camp and others in host families. This makes the humanitarian situation very alarming in the province of South Kivu in general and in the territories of Uvira, Fizi and Walungu in particular on all levels. According to the report of our assessments with OCHA and according to the reports of Several UN, international and national organizations, the populations of the territories of Uvira, Fizi and Walungu are in a situation of:

- ✓ Chronic food insecurity and famine;
- ✓ malnutrition;
- ✓ Lack of easy access to primary health care;
- ✓ The practice of sexual violence against women and girl
- ✓ lack of access to drinking water;
- ✓ Lack of shelter;
- ✓ Generalized poverty
- The inaccessibility to education for children, especially for those of internally displaced persons;

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On the basis of the previous, the situation of the populations of the Territories concerned by the initiatives of AFPDE is very alarming and even exceeds the capacity of the humanitarian workers who are at work on the field. UNHCR has even expressed concern for this.

This situation is caused mainly by recurrent clashes between the army and the militia. In addition to this, there is also pillages of the armed forces, the impassable roads and road barriers are now worsening the situation and hampering humanitarian to reach people who need assistance.

In addition to the above, we can also mention the drought that has been at the root of the destruction of several crops in the Ruzizi plain which has accentuated the situation of food insecurity and malnutrition in this part of the Territory from Uvira and Walungu.

I.2. Final beneficiaries of AFPDE actions in 2017

In 2017, AFPDE provided assistance to members of local communities in difficult situation, Burundian refugees, IDPs and refugees, and women and girls who were victims of sexual violence.

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These people are located in 7 health zones namely Fizi, Nundu, Uvira, Ruzizi, Lemera, Nyangezi and Kaniola.

And overall 252,594 people were assisted including:

- ✓ 109,538 persons through the emergency project for Burundian refugees.
- ✓ 127,320 persons through the project of prevention and treatment of HIV AIDS and malaria.

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- ✓ 15,436 persons through the project of assistance to women and girls victims of sexual violence in Kamanyola and Kaniola.
- ✓ 100 persons through the support project for women and girls who have been victims of sexual violence in Lubarika.
- ✓ 17,700 inhabitants of the Kilibula quarter are constituted in majority by the poorest of Uvira
- ✓ 200 children through the project of support to education of orphaned and affected with HIV/AIDS.

I.3. Human resources

The AFPDE team consists exclusively of local staff made of employees and volunteers. Some work in two or three projects and others work exclusively in one project.

Thus, AFPDE staff is composed with the coordinator, members of the finance and administration team, members of the program and project team, organizers, psychosocial assistants and volunteers.

In addition to the staff mentioned in the table above AFPDE works with 66 members of the community relays and staff of the 14 medical structures and 4 health zones, who have received bonuses paid by our various projects and who ensure the community awareness and medical care of the beneficiaries of the various projects and participate in the follow-up activities organized by AFPDE.

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I. 4. Material resources

During the year 2017, AFPDE used substantial material means that enabled it to provide assistance to the most vulnerable people in the 3 territories in which it intervened, in real time and in a timely manner and to allow teams at all levels to work in good conditions.

These material means consist of rolling stock, office furniture and equipment, the computer equipment and office supplies it has for a long time. This year, its car ownership increased with the acquisition of a used JEEP LAND CRUISER HARDPORT 4x4 and a new ambulance (LAND CRUISER 4x4) made available to the Nundu Health Zone to facilitate the transfer of patients from Lusenda refugee camp to Nundu General Hospital for proper medical care.

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Apart from this, the organization has acquired a solar kit that allows it to use all the machines it has and to have lighting all night without interruption.

As a capital asset, the organization has its own office facilities, although currently they are no longer suitable and able to accommodate all AFPDE staff members.

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II. SUMMARY OF ACHIEVEMENTS FOR THE YEAR 2017

The implementation of activities during the year 2017 was part of the overall goal of AFPDE to sustainably improve the living conditions of its final beneficiaries in a context marked by armed conflict and the humanitarian crisis more and more serious. More specifically, the actions of the AFPDE during the year 2017 aimed at strengthening the capacities of the measures of prevention of HIV AIDS, malaria and diseases of dirty hands and the improvement of the conditions of access to primary health care, access to safe drinking water and access to education for refugees, IDPs, people living with HIV / AIDS, pregnant women and children under 5, children of schooling age and women and girls who are victims of sexual violence.

II.1. EXPECTED RESULTS BY PROJECTS

The expected results of the implementation of activities by project in 2017 by AFPDE are:

II.1.1. Project to strengthen the fight against HIV/AIDS and Malaria in the Uvira (Ruzizi Plain) and Walungu (Kamanyola) Territories.

- ✓ Result1.: Facilitators, Health Promoters and Community Representatives Use the different techniques of continuous and sustainable sensitization as a way to raise awareness about HIV / AIDS and Malaria
- ✓ Result 2: Preventive and responsible behavior of the population with regard to HIV / AIDS and malaria is stimulated by intensive sensitization, capacity building and support to the affected population.

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✓ Result 3.: The socio-economic and psychosocial situation and the health status of persons HIV / AIDS, the prevention and treatment of malaria has been steadily improving in the target areas of the project.

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2.2. ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE YEAR 2017

As part of the resumption of activities for the year 2017 and after the end of year holidays, a large meeting was held in Uvira for all key staff members of the various projects implemented by the AFPDE. All 53 people were present and some members of local committees. This meeting, in a framework of exchanges between the participants, was intended to allow:

- ✓ Discussions between AFPDE staff to create the conditions for a good recovery necessary to achieve the objectives:
- ✓ The sharing between participants of the objectives, expected results and activities of the different projects to be implemented during the year 2017;
- ✓ To reaffirm AFPDE's commitment to actively participate in the implementation and monitoring of activities of the different projects so that their objectives are achieved.

Five main points were on the agenda of the meeting:

- ✓ Presentation of the objectives of the meeting
- ✓ Presentation of the different staff members of the different projects
- ✓ General presentation of the various projects implemented by AFDEF and their respective objectives;
- ✓ Presentation of expected results and activities to be implemented by the projects and stakeholders;
- ✓ Discussion on presentations and collection of expectations of staff members and committee members

This meeting created conditions for collaboration and ownership of activities in the implementation of field actions. The meeting helped to draw lines of collaboration, each in its own field, and to make them understand the role they must play in achieving the objectives that the organization has set for 2017.

2.3. ACTIVITIES PERFORMED BY PROJECT AND BY RESULT

2.3.1. Project to strengthen the fight against HIV / AIDS and Malaria in the Uvira (Rusizi plain) and Warungu (Kamanyola) territories.

✓ **Result 1.:** Facilitators, Health Promoters and Community Representatives use the different techniques of continuous and sustainable awareness as a means of raise public awareness about HIV / AIDS and malaria

To achieve this result, several training sessions had been organized in 2016. Nevertheless, in order to maintain the level acquired during the 2016 training sessions, exchanges and capacity-building meetings are organized every two months during the year 2017 by the different facilitators, health promoters and community representatives on local committees and community relays.

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Result 2.: Preventive and responsible behavior of the population with regard to HIV / AIDS and malaria is stimulated by intensive sensitization, capacity building and support to the affected population.

During the year 2017, the following actions were carried out to contribute to the achievement of this result:

- > Education on HIV and malaria in different places
- > The distribution of 18812 condoms including 17471 condoms and 1341 FEMIDONS and 3000 mosquito nets
- > The radio broadcasts 6 times a week for raising awareness about HIV / AIDS, the malaria and family planning in 3 radio stations.
- The distribution of 5,000 information leaflets and other information documents
- > The realization, every week, of a day of action for the cleaning of municipalities (garbage removal, hatcheries, etc.)
- Accompanying 50 women in a program to prevent mother-to-child transmission of HIV
- Medical management of 300 pregnant women before and children under 5 for malaria;
- > Identification of 70 micro-credit beneficiaries and their training on rotating micro-credits;
- > Granting of micro credit 150 5 per beneficiary in nature;
- Ensure intensive monitoring each week by regular visits of beneficiaries to their activities

✓ **Result 3:** The socio-economic and psychosocial situation and the health status of people affected by HIV / AIDS, prevention and treatment of malaria has been steadily improving in the target areas of the project.

The following activities were completed this year to help achieve this result:

> Providing medications to 6 partner medical facilities each month to treat opportunistic infections and malaria;

> Counseling and screening of 12935 people through the DV Mobile and fixed installed in partner medical structures;

> Dosing of CD4 in in favor of people living with HIV AIDS

- > Sensitization (by UCOP members) of people living with HIV AIDS of their rights in favor of 290 persons
- > Provision of support and legal support to 6 victims of discrimination and stigmatization

2.3.2 Project to improve health care, sanitation, hygiene conditions and access to drinking water for Burundian refugees and the local population in the health zone of Nundu in Fizi Territory, DR Congo - Phase II

For this project, the following activities were carried out according to the results:

✓ Result 1: Improvement of basic health care and maternal and child health care 50,000 refugees and 20,000 vulnerable members of the local population

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- Provide medical care for 76,159 Burundian refugees and community members through 7 medical structures and a mobile clinic thanks to the monthly supply of these drug structures for medicines and the payment of the premium to the nursing staff;
- o The continuity of awareness activities on the prevention of malaria, HIV AIDS, maternal health and hygiene and sanitation through this realization. We reached 109538 people sensitized.
- Continuation of voluntary HIV testing activities for refugees and members of local communities through the 6 VCTs installed in medical facilities and in the camp and at the mobile VCT supported by screening inputs;
- o The continued distribution of condoms to sensitized individuals who request it;
- o Transport of 262 refugee patients and members of local communities of medical structures primary to Nundu General Hospital thanks to the arrival of the medical ambulance and its provision to the health zone on ...;
- o The construction of the health center of Mulongwe / Katalukulu:
- Construction of two maternity clinics in Munene Health Centers and Mboko Health Center;

The rehabilitation and equipment of the zonal pharmacy and the central office of the zone of health;

Result 2.: Improvement of hygiene, sanitation and water supply conditions in 50,000 refugees and 30,000 vulnerable members of the local population

o The repair of the 6 suckers in the Lusenda camp;

The rehabilitation of 3 ancient springs and the capture of 3 new additional water plants our ces at Mulongwe and the installation of the adduction of the Mulongwe camp the installation of two 95 m3 tanks each, construction of two reinforced concrete seats, a 6 km5 water pipe, a 2 km water distribution network with 15 taps; The construction of the health center of Mulongwe camp to allow the care medical refugees and members of local communities;

The purchase of all plumbing and water treatment equipment and supplies for both camps (closure, sodium sulphate, ramps, pipes, physicochemical water analysis kits, the two 93 m3 tanks, the faucets, ...)

supply of the Lusenda camp with clore and sodium sulphate to ensure the treatment of drinking water:

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Construction of 8 blocks of 3 VIP latrines and 1 Block of 4 latrines with their hand washing systems;

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- The beginning and continuation of the rehabilitation works of the Mboko and Nundu additions;
- o The distribution of sanitary towels to women and girls of childbearing age,
- The provision of a water analysis kit at Lusenda camp;
- The continuous supply of plumbing and water treatment equipment and supplies for the Lusenda camp (Clore, sodium sulphate, cupping, faucets, ...)
- The participation of the Project Manager and APDE Wash Manager for WASH Training in an Emergency, Dakar, Senegal

2.3.3 Assistance Project for Survivors of Sexual Violence in Walungu Territory [Kamanvola and Kaniola]

Result 1. The communities of Kamanyola and Kaniola were made aware of the sexual violence (16 forms of sexual violence, methods of preventing sexual violence and laws of IGNATUR repression of sexual violence).

To achieve this result, the following activities were organized:

- > 226 counseling sessions were conducted for 97 victims of sexual violence;
- ➤ Medical assistance and psychological counseling for 97 women and girls victims of sexual violence in Kaniola and Kamanvola;

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III. ENCOUNTERED DIFFICULTIES

Le 11.5. MAY .. 2018 In general, the association did not experience any difficulties in carrying out its activities. These difficulties are of technical, institutional and financial nature, namely:

- 1. The lack of funds to expand its activities in many parts of the territories of Uvira, Fizi and Walungu and especially in South Kivu Province of the province in general, thereby reaching a great number of people living in a difficult situation.
- 2. Insecurity in some sites of intervention which sometimes handicaps the activities of organizing and making sure that we end up with several gaps to solve.
- 3. The continued arrival of Burundian refugees in the territories of Uvira and Fizi who came aggravated the precarious situation in this part of the country;
- 4. the lack of technical training of the members of the staff of the association.

These are difficulties that slow down the execution of our activities and the achievement of our objectives.

AFPDE alone can not solve them. Therefore, the contribution of all people and organizations of good will are needed to meet the challenge.

IV. MISCELLANEOUS

During this year 2017, the association through its coordinator participated in discussion meetings to exchange at national and regional level, with a view to seeking solutions to problems women face for sustainable development.
