PERIOD POVERTY: THE CRISIS HOLDING GIRLS BACK

- 3 out of 4 girls in Mpigi miss school each year because of their periods.
- Without proper sanitation, girls risk infection and lasting health consequences.
- Early marriage rates are 20% higher in communities where girls lack menstrual resources.

This isn't just about physical needs; it's about missed potential and societal inequity.

Breaking taboos, peer-led education, community-wide change.


COMMUNITY-LED, SUSTAINABILITY FOCUSED
