REVIEW OF PROGRESS & RESULTS: The General Body Meeting of SST held on April 26, 2018, reviewed the progress & results and approved the annual activity report for the year 2017-18. The following are the activities under taken and progress/results achieved during the year. 1. DISTRIBUTION OF BASIC MATERIAL NEEDS TO DESTITUTE OLD AGE WOMEN:

We have conducted the distribution of clothing & bedding material to destitute old age persons on 14/05/2017 at Matha Sree Annapurnesawri Vriddashramam, Kurnool, Kurnool Mandal, Kurnool District, Andhra Pradesh, India. 26 Old Age Persons both Male and Female were benefitted. Pencils, sharpeners, dictionaries, general knowledge books, English grammar books etc. to 50 Poor Adolescent Girls. The educational standards of orphan students will improve with this program. OTF, Canada supported for this program. An amount of Rs.20, 000/was spent towards this program.

4. NATIONAL SEMINAR SEMESTER BASED AND CHOICE-BASED CREDIT SYSTEM:

The National Seminar on Issues and Challenges in Effective Implementation of Semester Based and Choice-Based Credit System was from 29th to 30th June, 2017 at Hotel Suraj Grand, Kurnool City, Kurnool District, Andhra Pradesh. 109 participants from different vocations like Lecturers, Researchers, Students, Educational Volunteers, Intellectuals, NGOs, Social workers etc. attended the seminar. 18 Speakers/Resource Persons representing Professors, Lecturers, Educationalists, NGOs Leaders etc. presented papers on various sub themes of the seminar. The seminar reviewed the Issues and Challenges of Semester Based and Choice-Based Credit System. The seminar also examined the impact and the implementation of the system. During the seminar, the Speakers/Resource presented papers and suggested the ways and means of Effective Implementation of Semester Based and Choice-Based Credit System. An amount of Rs. 9, 18,865/- was spent on this program. 1st quarter programs were conducted from 04/09/2017 to 19/09/2017 in 11 villages Gudur Mandal of Kurnool District, Andhra Pradesh. 2nd quarter programs were conducted from 08/01/2018 to 26/01/2018 in 11 villages of Kodumur Mandal of Kurnool District, Andhra Pradesh. We educated and spread awareness among the excluded sections of the society about benefits of financial literacy, information about various financial products available on various channels explaining the procedure / formalities, RBI Guidelines on KYC, Opening of Accounts, Loans, Deposits, Jandhan accounts. Financial transactions, Social security insurance schemes, RBI Initiatives on Consumer protection. Banking Ombudsman, Charter of Consumer Rights, Customer Rights Policy, Complaint Redressal Mechanisms etc. 4 resource persons from our organization and guest speakers from banks & local government participated in the workshops. 1295 participants like SHGs Women, Social Workers/NGOs, Youth Volunteers, and Businessmen/Farmers etc. benefitted from the program. Participants' awareness levels on financial literacy, various financial products available on various channels, financial services procedure/formalities, opening of accounts etc. increased. Capacities of participants /depositors on financial literacy including safe and secure banking enhanced. Participants' awareness levels on RBI guidelines/regulations on KYC, opening of accounts, loans. deposits, jandhan accounts, financial transactions, social security insurance schemes etc. increased. Knowledge of financial consumers on RBI initiatives on consumer protection, banking ombudsman, charter of consumer rights, customer rights policy, complaint redressal mechanisms etc. enhanced. Participants awaked on digital banking and cashless transactions. Participants educate on message of RBI on financial literacy financial consumers awaked on fraudulent financial companies, multi level marketing, chit fund companies, un-recognized NBFIs.

6. SEMINAR ON TELUGU LANGUAGE & LITERATURE:

Seminar on Importance of Telugu Language and Literature was organized on 15^t July, 2017 in KVR Government College for Women, Kurnool City, Kurnool District, Andhra Pradesh. 150 participants from Telugu Lecturers, Persons working on Telugu Language & Literature and Degree College Students attended the seminar. 10 Speakers/Resource Persons representing Lecturers in Telugu, Educationalists and Personalities working on Telugu Language &Literature etc. participated in seminar. The seminar reviewed the Issues and Challenges of Telugu Language and Literature. The seminar also examined the importance of Telugu Language and Literature. During the seminar, the Speakers/Resource presented their views, shared their experience and suggested the ways and means of promotion of Telugu Language and Literature. Sri J.S.R.K.Sharma, Secretary, Telugu Basha Vikasodyamam, Kurnool District, Andhra Pradesh; Sri Sri V.Anjaneyulu, Director-SST, Kurnool; Sri Mr.A.V.Ramanaiah, State Resource Person; Mrs.M.Indira Santhi, In charge Principal, KVR Government Degree College for Women; Dr.V.Sridevi, Reader in Telugu, Dr.Mandi Anwar, Reader in Telugu, Osmania College; Dr.T.Suryanarayana Reddy, Lecturer in Telugu, Osmania College and others participated in the seminar. 7. STATE LEVEL SEMINAR ON ACID ATTACKS:

State Level Seminar on Acid Attacks: Rehabilitation Policies for Acid Attack Victims was conducted in collaboration with National Commission for Women, New Delhi on 27th March, 2018 at Conference Hall, KVR Government Degree College for Women, Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh. Shri M.A. Somasekhar, Senior Civil Judge & Secretary, District Legal Service Authority, Kurnool; Dr. (Mrs.) C.V.Rajeswari, Principal, KVR Government Degree College for Women; Dr.(Mrs.) V.Sridevi, Reader Telugu; Dr. (Mrs.) M. Indira Santhi, Lecturer; Mr. V. Anjaneyulu, Director, Dinakar NGO; Mr. M.A.Thirupathaiah, Advocate & Member, Mr.A.V.Ramanaiah, Ms.Faizunnisa, etc. participated as guests and resource persons. We discussed on Physical, psychological, social, financial effects of the victims of acid attacks; Sufficiency or otherwise of the existing laws to provide relief and rehabilitation to the acid attack survivors; Need and methods of compensation to the victims of acid attacks and their families; Health care & treatment facilities to the acid attack survivors; psychological rehabilitation of the acid attack survivors; financial rehabilitation of the acid attack survivors; need of rehabilitation centers for the acid attack survivors; need and methods speedy and strong rehabilitation mechanisms for victims of acid attacks; measures to prevent, control and minimize the incidence of acid attacks on girls/women etc. We have spent Rs. 102100/- for this seminar.

8. FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO POOR STUDENTS:

With the financial support from former B.A students of Silver Jubilee Government Degree College, Kurnool, we initiated "M.K.Ramakrishnan Memorial Merit Scholarship" in the memory of Sri M.K.Ramakrishanan, Former Principal of Silver Jubilee Government Degree College to encourage and support the present Meritorious Students of B.A Course. As part of it during this year, we have sponsored examination fee @Rs. 600/- to 10 poor students of silver jubilee college, Kurnool. We also extended financial support to poor school students of municipal school, old town, Kurnool. We have spent Rs.16000/- on this activity with donations from individual philanthropists and members contributions.

9. CONSUMER EDUCATION PROGRAMS:

As a Consumer Advocacy Group of TRAI, We have conducted consumer education workshops in association with Jio, Air Tel, Telenor, Tata Docommo etc. We also resolved Appeal of Telecom Complaints as a member of Air Tel Advisory, Jio, Telenor, Tata Docommo Advisory Committees. We also have conducted Consumer Rights Awareness Camps at Kurnool. 178 Participants Like SHGs Women, Youth, Farmers Etc. Participated in the Camps. We Educated on Various Rights of Consumers, Consumer Redressal Mechanism, and Consumer Forums etc. We have spent Rs. 24500/for this programs.

10. CULTURAL PROGRAMS ON SOCIAL EVILS & SCIENCE FOR MASSES:

In our area, there persist various social evils like blind beliefs, superstitions, child labour, child marriages, untouchability, gender discrimination etc. Community lack scientific awareness. We conducted cultural programs like songs, plays, mono actions etc. on social evils and science for masses to create awareness among rural people particularly of uneducated sections of the community. We conducted this program in 4 villages with about 500 participants. We have spent Rs. 25450/- on this activity with donations from individual philanthropists and members contributions.

11. CLIMATE CHANGE EDUCATION PROGRAM:

We have conducted Workshop on Climate Change in India: Opportunities & Challenges on 28th March, 2018 at Conference Hall, KVR Government Degree College for Women, Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh. The purpose of the workshop is to create awareness and disseminate information on various aspects of climate change, the way forward the eight national missions related to climate change, possible impacts of projected climate change, changes in climate and weather events in India, projections of climate change over India for the 21st century, climate change and its impact on Indian and global economy etc. About 150 students and lecturers participated in the workshop. We have spent Rs. 34850/- on this activity with donations from individual philanthropists and members contributions.

12. VOCATIONAL SKILL TRAINING PROGRAM COMPUTERS & TAILORING:

We have provided Computer & IT-Enabled skills like computer literacy, Internet, smart phones, social networks, soft skills & communicative English trainings for a period of three months to 30 youth. This program will address the dearth of Computer & IT-Enabled skill inputs being experienced by several youth particularly of marginalized in Kurnool Mandal of Kurnool district of Andhra Pradesh.

Women lack skills to take up employment or self employment for their economic empowerment. Hence, we provided three months training in tailoring and embroidery for 30 women and girls at Kallur. We trained them in machine control, cutting and stitching. We also trained them in hand embroidery work. We sensitized them on savings, bank loans, government subsidies & incentives. They were able to do the tailoring and embroidery work and earn additional income for their better living. Their economic and social status enhanced. We have spent Rs. 65000/- on this activity with donations from individual philanthropists and members contributions.
